Rector's Article.

Dear all.

As the year winds gently to its close, we find ourselves standing at the edge of reflection. The seasons have turned, the days have passed, and now—like farmers gathering the fruits of their labour—we come to bring our harvest before God.

In our five communities these Harvest Services are held in September and October. Marked in some communities with Harvest Suppers either in Church, Village Halls or Village fields. The three Schools within our communities normally celebrate this event in the Church, giving to different Charities and groups.

Looking back, in 2020 we marked the season with a style by having a Group Harvest online Service led by the youngsters. We had speeches from one of the Farmers in the community and someone from Paradise Wildlife Park. The Anglican Shona group contributed by singing a hymn. Last year, 2024, at Ponsbourne, we had a three course meal, fabulous! People enjoyed that. At Little Berkhamsted we had the Harvest Supper in Church, afterwards we fellowshipped until late at night. At Bayford and Brickendon we met with the community at Bayford fields after the Harvest Service and ate together. At Essendon we sum up the year with a 'Candlelit Supper', arranged by the Friends of the Church, people come in

numbers in the Church and delicious food is served. There is joy when Church integrates with the community. Psalm 133: 1 "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity"!

Harvest may also mean celebrating quiet victories we've won, the relationships we've nurtured, the lessons we've learned through hardship and grace. It may be the strength we found when we thought we had none, or the joy that surprised us in the midst of sorrow.

Now is the time to say thank you. In ancient times, the harvest was a sacred moment—a time to gather, to celebrate, and to offer the first fruits back to the One who gave them. Today, we do the same. We bring our year's journey, our triumphs and trials, and lay them at the feet of God—not out of obligation, but out of love. Hence, in 1 Thessalonians 5:18), it says: "In everything give thanks to the Lord". Gratitude is not just a feeling—it's an offering.

So as we close this chapter, let us not rush past the sacred pause. Let us gather around tables, around altars, around each other, and say: "Thank you, Lord. You have been faithful."

May our gratitude be the seed of next

Garden Notes September

After what seems to have been rather an extraordinary year so far in our gardens whatever size our areas are, nature has a wonderful way of sorting things out and it surely will again! I have been amazed when it has looked at times as if things were going to be a bit of a disaster but it all seems somehow to have quietly sorted itself out! I have also been fascinated by how wonder-fully 'clean' two or three new roses I put in last year have been - I haven't had to spray them as they have looked so well' - along with that all I have had to do is just quietly feed them a bit!



Take a really good look now and make a serious note of things that are not quite in the right place - perhaps something attractive has now become bigger than originally expected and is hiding something else special! In the weeks ahead keep an eye open for brambles in hedges and borders and be very firm with their removal as it is amazing how they manage to take over if not firmly removed and thrown out! Treat tree seedlings the same way, only perhaps keeping the very best one - and be sure it is in the right position!

Dig up and divide clumps of early-flowering perennials if you haven't already done so and make sure you water them in well in their new positions and pass others on exchanging plants with fellow gardeners is fascinating as to how these plants adapt to their "new homes"! If you have plans for any new trees and shrubs this autumn get them ordered in good time and make sure they are well-watered in in their new position when they arrive. If you have a small pond, cover it with netting to catch any rubbish and this will help prevent algae next spring.

With all this clearing up and 'tidying', perhaps think of starting a new compost heap with what you remove and, if you have room, away from your existing one. Tidy that one up as it is amazing how they "spread"! If you have any spare packets of annuals you didn't sow earlier, scatter them on any suitable areas of spare earth and you will, perhaps, be surprised next Spring depending on the coming winter! Don't forget to label dahlias still in flower before you lift them, particularly their colour and height - I forgot to do that that last year!

Chicken with Cider and Apples Serves 4.

A tasty kitchen supper to celebrate the flavours of autumn with friends or family. It is quite versatile too – I have used crème fraiche in the recipe, but this could be swapped out for double cream, plus you could add a couple of rashers of chopped up bacon to the apple and onions for extra flavour.



The end result is both sweet and savoury, definitely comfort food at its best. **Note:** You will need a large lidded frying pan or wide based casserole that you can use on the hob.

Ingredients:

4 chicken breasts, divided into two or three pieces, evenly sized (or 4-6 boneless chicken thighs).

 $\begin{array}{lll} \hbox{2tbs butter} & \hbox{250ml/1 cup, dry cider} \\ \hbox{1tbs olive oil} & \hbox{250ml/1 cup chicken stock} \\ \hbox{1 onion} & \hbox{150 ml crème fraiche} \end{array}$

2 apples, peeled, cored, cut into eight slices each

1 tsp English Mustard 100gr frozen peas

Method: Melt the butter with the oil in the frying pan. Season the chicken pieces with salt and pepper and place into the pan to brown on both sides – about 5-7 minutes. Take the chicken out of the pan and place on a plate to one side. Add the onion to the pan (including the chopped bacon if you are using) and cook for about five minutes until it is beginning to soften and the bacon has crisped up. Add the sliced apples and turn in the pan for a couple of minutes to take on some colour, then add the chicken stock and cider. Return the chicken pieces to the pan, making sure to scrape up any browned pieces from the bottom of the pan. Bring it up to a simmer. Place the lid on the pan and cook gently for about 25 minutes. After 25 minutes, remove the lid, and let the liquid reduce for 5 minutes. Now add the crème fraiche and mustard to the pan and give it a good stir to combine. Simmer for about 5 minutes, allowing the sauce to thicken slightly. Add the frozen peas – these will only take a couple of minutes to cook in the sauce and you are ready to serve.

Essendon Nature Notes

I am not sure why but this summer I have kept seeing a bird that it is always charming, colourful and loud, the green woodpecker. It is not that uncommon and you will see them now and again but lately on almost every walk they have made a guest appearance. Maybe the exceptionally dry spring we had this year enhanced the woodpeckers' breeding success as they feed on ants who appreciate the arid conditions and sometimes increase their own nest-building in times of drought.

The plumage of this woodpecker is really rather special with its red crown, green and yellow back and dashing black moustache with a touch of red in the males. Their long tongue with its sticky

secretion allows them to probe deep into anthills for their food and this culinary preference means you will more often see them on the ground than in the trees. If they are disturbed, they will be on their way with the bounding flight typical of the woodpecker family.



Unlike their other woodpecker cousins, the green variety rarely drums and

indeed I have never heard them do so. They do, however, have a surprising call which is a distinctive feature of this unique bird and when you hear it, it can't be mistaken. It cackles like an eccentric uncle laughing at his own jokes and is the source of its country name of 'yaffle'. Those of us old enough to remember the children's programme 'Bagpuss' will recall Professor Yaffle, the carved wooden bookend in the shape of a woodpecker who entertained us when life was more simple. Next time you are out, listen for the source of the inspiration and if you see one, its laugh just might make you smile.


