Dear all,

As we begin the new year 2026, we look back with gratitude and look forward with expectation. Throughout 2025 we have witnessed God's faithful presence in ministry and in the community. The three community Schools (Essendon, Ponsbourne and Bayford) each held well attended Festival Services in their respective area Churches.

Furthermore, amongst other good things, the Church held some special occasional services, to mention but a few recent ones - the baptism services of Artie and Alfie (twins) at Ponsbourne, Nora and Hallie at Brickendon, the wedding of Chloe and Jamie at Essendon, some community events held at Essendon and Little Berkhamsted Churches. The highlight of all - the Group Remembrance Service at Bayford Church and the nine lessons and Carols held in December. As a community we also shared sad moments - the passing on of some of our dear friends. However, though the year held its challenges, it revealed countless moments of grace and quiet transformation. In Scripture we find a model of how God's people prepared themselves for new seasons, new journeys, and new challenges. We ask the Lord to lead us in such a way that we can recognise His movement, trust His timing, and follow His direction without fear or hesitation.

As we continue to focus on spiritual renewal, practical service, and compassionate outreach. We desire to be a community that reflects Christ's love. Therefore, we commit the entirety of 2026 into His hands - every ministry, every decision, every opportunity, and every challenge.

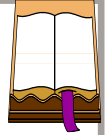

Garden Notes January

The last couple of months in our gardens weatherise have been unusual, particularly the lack of rain but possibly by the time you read this things will have changed!



The autumn colours were amazing and benefitted from the lack of rain but nature will, I am sure, rebalance things! January can be a month of gale-force winds but having to write this early for Christmas printing may make these comments rather out of date!

Keep a regular eye on the weather forecasts and plan accordingly.



One thing we can all do is to make sure our birds have regular food and water and keep an eye open for unusual visitors!

Check any recently planted trees and shrubs, and if it has been frosty make sure they are firm. Should we have any amount of snow carefully brush off as much as you can from these before the weight of it breaks young branches.

If weather conditions are kind prune wisteria and other vigorous climbers and do clear away any of your clippings.

This is also a good time to force rhubarb with protection.

Try taking hardwood cuttings of trees and shrubs - sometimes this works and sometimes it doesn't but do enjoy any successes!

Try warming up some soil with cloches for early seed-sowing outdoors and remember to book in and send the lawnmower for servicing!

And don't forget to browse your new seed catalogues.

Essendon Nature Notes

It was one of those morning walks when you think you have called it wrong. Should have brought a raincoat. Should have brought an extra layer. But the shower soon passed. After weeks of rain, finally the blue sky and white clouds resumed their prominence and the sun, low and bright, burnished and warmed everything with silver-soldered winter light.

As the dogs ran on ahead of me on the muddy footpath from Essendon Hill along the River Lea, their coats turned slowly from white to coffee-ground brown. A flock of twittering finches, about twenty or so, struck up a chorus from the barren trees above.

These were linnets, their twinkling chatter enlivening the quiet stillness. They were in their winter plumage, a rather drab striped brown affair, but they are lovely birds and stalwarts of the country scene.



Eventually they all took flight together, chinking together like loose change. When they are back in the spring, it will be all different with the breeding male in his ostentatious tailoring, a crimson breast and forehead and the female, still streaked and beige but more crisp and distinct than this season's sombre dress.



However, it is the song of the male that I look forward to through these shorter days, its melodic trilling and whistling notes like a bubbling brook. It will be worth the wait. Until then I will dig in for the winter, watching and listening for the more subdued sights and sounds of this turning year.

Cooking Ideas by Ruth Newton

Salmon Shimla

After the excess of Christmas, it can be nice to have something a bit lighter and refreshing. This is a quick, tasty supper that you can serve with rice and a salad, or you can substitute the salmon for chicken if you are not a fan of salmon. The salmon can be marinated for a couple of hours before cooking, but half an hour will be fine if you are short on time. The recipe serves two, but is easily doubled for more servings.



Ingredients:

2 x salmon fillets
Juice of half a lemon
1 tablespoon of mild curry powder
1 teaspoon of demerara sugar

Method:

For the marinade, combine the juice of half a lemon, curry powder, demerara sugar and salt in a bowl or shallow dish. Using a sharp knife, run the blade along the bottom of the salmon to remove the skin, and discard. Place the salmon into marinade and pop it in the fridge for at least half hour, or up to two hours. Heat the oven to 180c/gas mark 4. Remove the salmon from the marinade, reserving any that is left over in the bottom of the dish, and place the salmon in a clean dish. Bake in the oven for 15 to 20 minutes, until cooked through. If you are using chicken thighs or fillets, the cooking time will be a bit longer. Meanwhile, scrape any leftover marinade into a small saucepan and add 2 teaspoons of mango chutney, stirring to combine. Heat through until bubbling, and keep warm while the salmon cooks. Plate up the salmon and serve with any vegetables, salad, rice or potatoes, spooning the warmed sauce over the salmon.

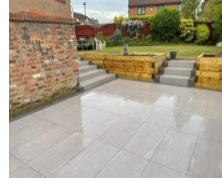
